

## WINTER WONDERLAND Felix Bernard & Dick Smith

Lyricist Dick Smith, suffering from tuberculosis in a Pennsylvania sanitarium in 1934, but inspired by the view out his window of folks playing in the snow of a city park, composed these lyrics. He died of tuberculosis at age 34 in 1935, never to know that his song has become beloved.
