

LOLLIPOP The Chordettes

Written by Julius Dixson & Beverly Ross, 1958: Dixson was late for a songwriting session with Ross because he was helping his daughter free a lollipop stuck in her hair. Ross wrote a song on the spot, liking the word “lollipop”!

2 beats/chord unless noted. First sung note: G 1,2,3,4 1,2,3,4

CHORUS

(sing chorus a cappella;
repeat, adding ukes)

C Am F G7
Lollipop, lollipop, oh lolli lolli lolli,
Lollipop, lollipop, oh lolli lolli lolli,
Lollipop, lollipop, oh lolli lolli lolli,
C//// C G7
Lollipop, lollipop (buh dum dum dum)

C Dm C Dm
Call my baby Lollipop, tell you why:
C Dm F G7
His kiss is sweeter than an apple pie;
C Dm C Dm
And when he does his shaky rockin' dance,

Man I haven't got a chance! I call him. . . **CHORUS**

Sweeter than candy on a stick, huckleberry, cherry, or li-ime.
